**TOWN OF PATTERSON**

Abstract      The Town of Patterson provides a Length of Service Award Program (“LOSAP”) to the members of the Town’s volunteer fire departments. LOSAP is a retirement/ award program that is used to recruit and retain volunteers, provided the volunteers achieve a certain amount of training and call response each year.

LOSAP was established in 1998 and permitted members to accrue benefits at the rate of \$20 per month per year of “active” service with, after full entitlement, an award benefit of \$400 per month (the “1998 Plan”).

LOSAP was then amended in 2008 to permit new members to accrue benefits at the rate of \$30 per month per year of “active” service with, after full entitlement, an award benefit of \$600 (the “2008 Plan”).

It has been requested that the Town of Patterson cause LOSAP to be amended to permit those volunteers who joined under the 1998 Plan at \$20 per month per year accrue benefits from 2008 forward at the rate of \$30 per month per year as if they joined under the 2008 Plan.
